This will make 2021 VSC's all the more important for safety on the water.





For even the most experienced boater, having another set of eyes checking your vessel condition and equipment is smart. Our VSC Inspectors will adhere to guidelines using mandated masks and be mindful of appropriate social distancing. Happy Spring Everyone! Mike and I are having fun playing with our new Nordic Tug 37. She's got more room than our beloved little red tug and she's got lots of bells and whistles including a Fly Bridge! We're looking forward to our Shake Down cruise to Belhaven and then a summer of boating.

I'm happy to report that we are slowly getting our squadron education rolling. It's an education process for me to learn the procedures and tools, and Mike and I have had to get creative in finding places to hold our trainings.

Our first offering will be an **America's Boating Course** will be held on June 5th. This all-day class is an excellent introduction to boating. It's great for new boaters to gain knowledge to keep your passengers, yourself, and your boat safe. In North Carolina all persons born on or after January 1, 1988 are required to take a NASBLA approved training craft to operate any watercraft of 10 HP or greater. Completion of this course meets that requirement. Any student passing this class also receives 18 months rather than 12 months membership if they join the Squadron following the class. Control & click here for more details.

We're also planning a **Boat Handling Course**. (This course replaces the retired Seamanship course.) This course is the foundation for other skill building USPS courses. We are planning to start on June 15 from 6pm – 8pm and meet for six consecutive Tuesdays evenings. Something different about this course is the way that it is organized. Each week an independent topic is presented, so you can choose to attend the entire 6 week course and be awarded a grade of Seaman, or choose to attend only the topics of interest to you. Topics presented and tentative dates are:

June 15 – Rules of the Road: A Practical Approach

June 22 – Confidence in Docking and Undocking: Slow-Speed Maneuvering

June 29 – Boating with Confidence: Handling Your Boat Underway

July 6 – Anchoring with Assurance: Don't Get Carried Away

July 13 – Emergencies on Board: Preparation to Handle Common Problems

July 20 - Knots and Line Handling: The Knots You Need to Know

These trainings will be officially announced and available for registration very soon.

Boating Safety

Engine/Propulsion Cut-Off Devices – Federal Law Change

On April 1, 2021 a new federal law went into effect that requires the operator of any powerboat with an installed ECOS (Engine Cut-off Devices) to wear the ECOS link. The link is usually a coiled bungee cord lanyard clipped onto the operator's person, PFD or clothing and the other end attached to the cut-off switch, but there are plenty of variations on the market, including electronic wireless devices. The law applies on all "Navigable Waters of the US". The law applies to "Covered Recreational vessels" which means any motorized boat manufactured after 2018 with 3 or more horsepower that is less than 26 feet in length.

When an operator is wearing a link while underway, the engine will cut-off if the operator is separated from the operating area, an occurrence that can happen if the operator is ejected from the vessel or falls within the vessel. The shutdown of the engine is essential for safety reasons. If the operator is ejected from the vessel, the shutdown may prevent the operator from impacting the vessel's spinning propeller, and may aid the operator in safely returning to the drifting vessel.



The terms Engine Cut-Off Switch (ECOS) and Engine/Propulsion Cut-Off Devices are used interchangeably to denote a system that disables the propulsion engine when the operator is unexpectedly displaced from the vessel. Most U.S. boat manufacturers have voluntarily installed an ECOS on their boats for decades. It's important to know that, if your boat is equipped with a Cut-Off Switch, the law is that it must be used.

Why you should wear your Engine Cut-off Switch link?

A typical three-blade propeller running at 3,200 rpm can inflict 160 impacts in one second so it is critical that you are aware of what is going on around you. Be aware:

- People in the water may not be visible from the helm
- Account for passengers before starting the engineInform passengers about propeller hazard areas
- Be alert in congested areas and near swimming zones
- Take extra precaution around towed watersports
- Never permit riding on the bow, gunwale, transom, seatbacks, or other locations where an occupant could fall overboard
- Children should be watched carefully at all times it only takes a second to fall overboard
- You would childproof your home so think about childproofing your boat
- Establish rules for swim platform use, boarding ladders, and seating
- If someone falls overboard, STOP the boat; once clear begin recovery procedures
- Warning Never put your boat in reverse to pick someone up out of the water, always circle around going forward while keeping the person in the water visible to the boat operator at all times.


