Like all of you, I am looking forward to the return of a more "normal" environment once the COVID-19 pandemic is under control. The Americas Boating Club national meeting (virtual this year) is taking place during mid-February. I have been tuning into all of the Educational Department presentations and it is giving me lots of ideas about how to conduct training during these socially distant times.

I'm researching the virtual options to see what will work best for our instructors and students. I'll be flexible with switching classes to in person when that becomes a possibility. I am thinking of starting with an America's Boating Course (ABC's) for the beginners and then offering the new Boat Handling Course. This course takes the place of the retired Seamanship course and is conducted as 6 seminars. The seminars are Rules of the Road, Confidence in Docking and Undocking, Boating with Confidence, Anchoring with Assurance, Emergencies on Board, and Knots and Line Handling. Students will be register for the whole course to get a certification or just for individual seminars. I know that I'll appreciate a refresher on these topics!
