Kicking off National Safe Boating Week 2021

The US Coast Guard Auxiliary sponsored a Public Affairs Event kicking off National Safe Boating Week during a ceremony held on the Washington waterfront Friday afternoon, May 21. Invited participants were Pamlico Sail & Power Squadron, USCG Station Hobucken, NC Wild Life, several Fire Rescue and Mayors from Bath, Chocowinity, Washington and Greenville all of whom declared proclamations for safe boating week.

According to the United States Coast Guard statistics, the 2020 recreational boating season saw an increase of 24% in boating accidents and deaths compared to 2019. June, July and August of 2020 saw the highest rate of on-water deaths from recreational boating in 23 years. Following the 2020 pandemic year, there are more boaters on the water now than ever before.








OPEN FOR LAUNCHING!
