October 14th General Membership Dinner Meeting



Our August 19th General Membership Dinner Meeting was really enjoyable. Louise was able to secure Elise Carroll, Queen Ann Revenge Lab at ECU/Greenville. Elise is originally from Greenville, NC and actually began volunteering and interning at the QAR Lab during her undergraduate studies. After receiving her MA from ECU in 2018, she has participated in ECU field projects in

Costa Rica, North Carolina, and participated in diving projects with NC's Underwater Archaeology Branch. Elise is a PADI Dive Master, a DAN Diving First Aid for Professional Divers/Diving Emergency Management Instructor, and a Cultural Resources Emergency Support Team (CREST) responder. Amazing lady!

Queen Anne's Revenge was the flagship of Edward Teach, also known as "Blackbeard," during the period known as the "Golden Age of Piracy." Prior to its capture by pirates, the ship was called *La Concorde* and was used to transport 1,265 African men, women, and children from West Africa to the New World to be sold into slavery. Discovered in 1996, the site is of international importance and is the second-oldest shipwreck discovered in North Carolina. The remains lay relatively undisturbed since the vessel ran aground in 1718. The shipwreck was located in 1996 about one mile off Shakleford Banks near the Beaufort Inlet.



Relatively intact archaeological remains provide substantial insights into early 18th-century marine activities in the New World, including naval armament and warfare, cannons, small weapons, ship tools for construction and repair, colonial provisioning, medical items and shipboard life. Since the project began in 1996, archaeologists have recovered hundreds of thousands of artifacts. Elise estimated they were approximately 60% through the evacuation from the ocean floor.

Artifacts that have been found, x rayed, cleaned, researched, preserved and recorded before they are released to the official repository, the North Carolina Maritime Museum in Beaufort.

You may remember how pleased we were to announce that Jeremy Orchard had volunteered to take on the role of Squadron Webmaster. Well we all know how life can toss us curves...Jeremy is no longer able to make that commitment. We truly appreciate his willingness to enthuastically agree

and sorry that the communication team will not have the opportunity to work with him after all.

This means we are again seeking a member who would be willing to take on the role of Webmaster. We are fortunate that Steve Neckyfarow will be able to work in tandem with our new Webmaster for a number of months. Steve has indicated that since the website is set and simply requires some maintance and monitoring, the technical skill set desired is actually not as sophisicated as you might think.

The website is designed and maintained using Joomla and the web hosting service is Bluehost (https://www.bluehost.com/). Skills required include general knowledge of the internet and email. Learn to use the Joomla application to maintain and update the website pages and other structures. Joomla is very intuitive and many features mirror Microsoft Word. Limited knowledge of "html" and various tools to maintain images, pdf files, banners, etc. General knowledge of the Google for non-profits administrator application in order to maintain the email forwarding addresses for officers. This knowledge is easily shared/learned while Steve remains involved.

Steve has estimated his level of effort is approximately 11 to 12 hours at the beginning of each year following new bridge elections and another 10 hours in total scattered over the the balance of the year. The majority of the web page text and calandar updating is handled by me.


