## **Boating Education**

Our Education Officer and his team planned courses and seminars for members, surrounding yacht clubs and the public offerings for area local recreational boaters.

- > When recruiting for volunteers for the Education department, the effort was made to encourage a team approach rather than an officer & assistant. The result is a 4-person team that is working very well, keeping everyone's individual efforts at a reasonable level and allowing for successful scheduling of many educational courses/seminars.
- ➤ Rules of the Road Seminar was held April 13<sup>th</sup>, presented by a seasoned shipping Captain with 32 students attending.
- > The America's Boating Course was presented May 19 & 20 graduating 17 students; 2 of those students became members.
- > Cruise & Cruise Planning Course was presented May (10 wks) with 7 students, all graduating.
- ➤ Weather Seminar presented July 25 by a member and past airline pilot providing enhanced additional information for 25 students.
- ➤ Marine Radio Seminar was presented September 26 with 21 students attending.
- > Partner in Command Seminar was presented Oct 24 with 24 students attending.
- > Communicated with local newspapers, radio & TV, surrounding boating clubs, yacht clubs and boating retailers encouraging boating skill building opportunities in our area.
- > Maintains a public group on Facebook social media to promote education opportunities, safety, events and civic involvement.
- > A team of Editors publish monthly educational, safety and boating information articles for the local Washington Daily Newspaper Boating tips column.

### **Civic and Community Involvement**

The Squadron continues its efforts to strengthen our mission throughout Beaufort County in our community involvement.

- > 22 Vessel Safety Inspections were performed for local boaters by our certified VSC Inspectors.
- Promoted National Safe Boating Week with newspaper articles, a Mayor Proclamation and materials kicking off National Safe Boating week May 20th at a booth outside Walmart entrance with 12 volunteers throughout the day.
- ➤ Collected marine related donations in anticipation of the annual WHDA Maritime Festival. Event was cancelled and a plan is in place for a Marine Flea Market in early 2024. The money from this annual event supports our efforts for boating safety and education within Beaufort County.
- > Members attended the ribbon cutting ceremony at Beaufort Community Collage's new Boat Building classroom and construction facility.
- > VSC Inspectors participated in the 1<sup>st</sup> Annual Marine Trade Fair for Beaufort County High School students Oct 3rd. The Fair advocated to students the value of learning marine trades and the opportunities in that coastal industry.
- Maintained annual membership in the Washington-Beaufort County Chamber of Commerce.
- > Participated in the Marine Corps Toys for Tots program filling 7 collection boxes at 2 YC locations, golf club location and our November member social luncheon.
- ➤ Participated in Salvation Army's Red Kettle kickoff breakfast. Further supported their efforts by Bell Ringing December 15<sup>th</sup> with efforts of 24 members throughout the entire day.

### **Social, Boating and Fellowship Activities**

In addition to our commitment to safe boating through education, our Squadron truly enjoys fun on and off the water.

- ➤ Members enjoyed our Change of Watch Luncheon, Elections and Member Award Recognitions in February 2023.
- ➤ Held four General Membership Dinner Meetings with exceptionally interesting local speakers, two of which expanded to member on-site tours of their facilities.
- > Members enjoyed our annual Christmas Party with dinner, musical entertainment and holiday games that had everyone engaged and heavily competing.
- > Popular social "Just for Fun" lunches/dinners were enjoyed at 5 local restaurants, very well attended.
- > Our boaters were active, creating a Cruise Wish List by members which was used to develop cruises for the year.
- > Throughout the various cruise destinations, car riders joined the boaters whenever possible for dinners, etc.
- Cruises included extended cruise to Dowry Creek/Manteo & The Great Chesapeake Bay cruise in April/May. Other Cruises included July to Oriental & Beaufort; October to New Bern/River Dunes wrapping up with the Fall Cruise to Dowry Creek in November. Unfortunately, the Ocracoke Labor Day Cruise was cancelled due to severe weather.

- > The Bridge and Executive Committee met monthly 9 times to monitor and conduct the affairs of the squadron.
- > Delegates attended all national and district meetings.
