
members.

### **Vessel Safety Check Chairman**

It's that time of year...Have you gotten your 2017 Vessel Safety **Inspection yet?** 



A certified Vessel Safety Check (VSC) is an excellent way to make sure your boat is ready for fun-filled, worry-free outings. VSC is a courtesy examination of your boat to verify the presence and condition of certain safety equipment required by State and Federal regulations.

As you know, this is not a "boarding" or a law enforcement check.

A vessel exam is conducted by one of our Certified Inspectors and typically takes 20 to 30 minutes. There is no penalty if your boat doesn't pass. Simple problems could be corrected on the spot; if not, the Inspector will gladly reinspect your boat at a later date. certified Vessel Safety Check (VSC) is an excellent way to make sure your boat is ready for fun-filled, worry-free outings. VSC is a courtesy examination of your boat to verify the presence and condition of certain safety equipment required by State and Federal regulations.

As you know, this is not a "boarding" or a law enforcement check.



problems could be corrected on the spot; if not, the Inspector will gladly re-inspect your boat at a later dateMore than eighty percent of all boats pass and receive an official VSC sticker. While having a sticker doesn't guarantee your boat won't be stopped by the Coast Guard, it does show your intent to operate safely. In addition, you may be able to save on boat insurance premiums.

We have completed testing the option of enabling members to pay for General Membership Dinner Meetings using a debit or credit card as an alternative to



paying by check. (You will still be able to pay by check if you choose.) This is being accomplished by using a PSPS PayPal account to receive payments and track orders. You are not required to have a PayPal account to use your credit card; however, if you do have a personal PayPal account you can use that to pay if you are so inclined.

The link below will allow you to initiate this process: http://pamlicosailandpowersquadron.org/payment.html

You will first select the meal you want from the dropdown menu and then click on "Buy Now". You will be taken to a page where you can select the quantity. This is a work in progress and we still need to determine how to combine different meal choices into a single transaction. In the meantime, if you want order one of each meal choice, you should complete payment for the 1st meal and then return to the first page where you can select the other meal option and follow this payment process again.

If you have a PayPal account that you want to use, you can log in and use that account. Otherwise, you can just select the "Pay with Debit or Credit Card" button to complete the transaction using your credit/debit card information.

We expect to use this payment option for educational classes open to the public as well as other areas and would appreciate any feedback you have relating to using this process for payments.



**River Dunes Marina** by boat is approximately 50 miles, easy access from the ICW. Leave Piney Point Light (4" FL R 2.5 S 15ft. 4m Rq Ref); to starboard and head for Marker #1 at entrance to Broad Creek (# 1 is located at 35 05 30 N x 76 35 00 W). Harbor depth measures 8'at MLW. They have floating docks, 30/50 amp shore power slip rates of \$1.90 per foot/night plus electric. Also, the Marina has fuel and courtesy cars.






