

WHO REALLY WAS CHRISTOPHER COLUMBUS



Longtime member of the Pamlico Sail and Power Squadron, Scott MacKenzie provided an interesting look into the inscrutable story of historical figure Christopher Columbus at the May Dining In at Washington Yacht and Country Club.




In his own inimitable style, Scott related his decades of historical inquiry into the true identity of this fabled seafarer to a packed and appreciative house of Squadron diners. While I look forward to my boating adventures, I always try to remain diligent in observing all safety checklists, rules and regulations. Therefore, I am devoting my message this month to boating safety and, specifically, drowning. I have unfortunately seen too many boating or personal water incidents involving family and friends that have resulted in injury and in one case, loss of life.

A Vessel Safety Checklist that can be found at

www.pamlicosailandpowersquadron.org, under the Vessel Safety tab, is a courtesy examination of your boat (Vessel) to verify the presence and condition of certain Safety Equipment required by State and Federal regulations. The Pamlico Sail & Power Squadron Vessel Examiner is a trained specialist and a member of the United States Power Squadrons®. They will make certain recommendations and discuss safety issues that will make you a safer boater. Some of the checklist items include:


Required Boating and Safety Equipment Display of required numbers Registration and Documentation Personal Flotation Devices (PFD's) Visual Distress Signals (VDS or flares) Fire Extinguishers Ventilation Backfire Flame Control Sound Producing Devices Navigation Lights Pollution Placard (vessels of 26+ feet) Marpol Trash Placard (vessels of 26+ feet) Marine Sanitation Device (head) State Regulations Navigation Rules



Overall Vessel Condition (Deck free of Hazards, Electrical/Fuel Systems, Galley/Heating Systems

This is not a "boarding" or a law enforcement issue. No citations are given as a result of this encounter, simply suggestions to improve your safe boating experience.

USPS COOPERATIVE CHARTING

The new Cooperative Nautical Reporting System is now up and running. The process involved to submit a Cooperative Charting Nautical Report is as follows:

Gather all the data related to your observation and organize as supporting documents on your computer. Examples include:


- A nautical chart that contains the features that you are reporting on (NOAA chart number, edition number and chart date)
- Photographs if appropriate
- Descriptions of hazard(s) or discrepancies
- Comments

Label the above and save as files on your hard drive.

Login to the member sign-on at the USPS.ORG website.

Go to the site index tab and choose Cooperative Charting.

Select Nautical Reporting from the column on the left.



Print a copy of the report for your records and submit the info to NOAA.

While the process is new, it is said to be easy. Watch this space as our squadron becomes familiar with this new procedure. John Holloway, our Coop Charting Chairman, and I will work hard to learn the new system and provide guidance to those who may wish to participate in Coop Charting. Feedback to NOAA on these important matters is key and it involves safety to boaters.....right at the heart of who we are as an organization.



Being knowledgeable about the many aspects of hurricanes is key to building a successful plan to minimize storm damage to you and your valuables.


In an effort to help us educate ourselves regarding major storms NOAA has completed a webinar series and posted them on <u>http://www.regions.noaa.gov/secar/index.php/highlights/noaas-2017-hurricane-season-awareness-webinars/</u>. On that site you may select free webinars with following titles:

New NOAA Satellite Capabilities and Tropical Cyclone Research Storm Surge Warnings and Graphics NHC and Local NWS Offices Overview of New Products and Services Hurricane Inland Flooding – Risks and Warnings

Once on the site you should request the individual webinar that you are interested in as the advance registration link to all of the webinars is now closed. I recommend "Storm Surge" and "Inland Flooding" as must see for us.

The most important part of preparedness is having a good plan and sticking to it. In many instances your marina may require you to have a written plan on file and some insurance companies also require them. 







Squadron Cruise To River Dunes
