Merit Marks Recognizing YOUR Volunteer Efforts

The USPS Merit Mark recommendations are designed to recognize individual member service during the calendar year. This is the only compensation, in addition to a heart-felt "Thank You", that our active members receive for their efforts at furthering the interests, programs and objectives

As our Squadron Commander, one of my most important jobs is to ensure that each individual who has contributed to our Squadron's mission is awarded this recognition. In November each year, the Bridge Officers review the efforts of their supporting Officers, Chairs, Committees and individual Members who have met the criteria to gain a Merit Mark. This effort amounts to ten hours or more of personal time devoted to the Pamlico Sail & Power Squadron.

Our Squadron's Merit Mark Chair, Bob Hatala, compiles Merit Mark recommendations into an electronic Merit Mark file, which is then entered into a three tier approval process: our Commander, the Merit Mark Area Monitor, and the USPS Chief Commander. Approved Merit Mark Certificates are then emailed to each of the member recipients. In the past, our squadron has awarded 40 plus individual member Merit Marks for volunteer service each year. Listed below are some examples and recommendations that will qualify **you** for a Merit Mark:

- ★ Teach an Educational Course or Seminar; all or just a segment of a class;
- Assist with Educational Course Offerings;
- ★ Participate in General Meeting planning of dinner, speakers, etc.;
- ★ Take part in Committee Meetings, both established & ad hoc;
- ★ Participate in Cooperative Charting efforts & submission;
- Assist in planning a cruise, raft-up and other boating activities;
- ★ Assist on land-based activities such as golf outings, dock parties, picnics, etc;
- Work on a Newsletter or provide articles for publishing;
- ✓ Participate in the Web Site team;
- Serve or work in any Organizational Chart Position;
- Work at the PSPS waterfront tent opportunities or Boat Shows;
- ★ Work on Communication & Public Relations activities;
- ★ Become a VSC Inspector or serve on a Vessel Safety Check Committee;
- * Participate with other organizations promoting Safe Boating.

Getting involved in one or more events or projects can be meaningful for you and further support the Pamlico Sail & Power Squadron in its efforts to reach the boating public within Beaufort County. Consider it this year; be a volunteer. We are looking forward to your participation and ideas!

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Here are some ideas where your volunteer efforts would be greatly appreciated:

Become a Vessel Safety Inspector

For those of you who really know your way around a boat, this is the perfect way for you to volunteer and support the PSPS safety mission. Become a certified Vessel Safety Inspector. Join Fred Schroeder at his annual VSC meeting at the end of March and learn if becoming a VSC Inspector is for you.

Based on the number of new VSC Inspectors, Fred will be holding a class to review the materials and will conduct the testing to bring the new Inspectors on board for the 2013 season. Once you are certified, you need only inspect 5 boats to continue to be qualified each year.

PSPS currently has 7 inspectors, but truly needs more to meet the number of recreational boaters we support for inspections. Please call Fred at 948-0682 or email your interest here.

Here's how:


- Gather your unwanted, used or new boating equipment, supplies, lines or anything nautical and donate to PSPS. There are two locations to drop off your items. All donations are tax-deductible and PSPS will give you a letter for our 2014 tax file.
- We also need 2 or 3 volunteers from 0700 to 0900 to assist in directing all market participants into parking areas and checking their registration to the market.
- Lastly, PSPS will have two spaces for our tent/boating information and to sell the donated items from our members to the public. We will need three people from 0900 to 1200; three people from 1200 to 1500 and three people from 1500 to 1800. Proceeds from the sale of the donated items will be used for public boating education.
